The 2011 Omaha Airport Flood Fight

Thursday, February 16th, 2012

The 2011 flood was a major news item for Eastern Nebraska and Western Iowa. Kiewit Corporation lead the efforts of hundreds of people and numerous engineering firms and contractors in the summer of 2011 to fight the Missouri River and keep the Omaha Airport safe, dry, and operational during the unprecedented flood event. URS Corporation was the lead geotechnical engineer developing the technical aspects of the flood fighting approach.

Brian, Francke, and Tyler will discuss the emergency response developed for the flood fight, the mobilization and management of resources, the geotechnical aspects of the flood fight, and the technical responses developed and implemented to address issues including underseepage, sand boils, sink holes, and surface flooding.


